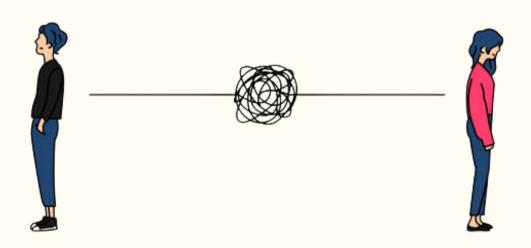
Moral injury

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POSTTRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER (PTSD)

A MENTAL DISORDER THAT MAY BE CAUSED BY EXPOSURE TO SPECIFIC TYPES OF SEVERE, PSYCHOLOGICALLY TRAUMATIC EVENTS.





INVOLVES DIFFERENT COMBINATIONS OF SLEEP DISTURBANCES, FLASHBACKS, TRIGGERS, REGULAR VIVID RECALL, AND INTRUSIVE MEMORIES.

PTSD & THE COVID-19 Pandemic

POSTTRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER (PTSD) IS A POTENTIALLY DISABLING CONDITION THAT IS NOW A WIDELY RECOGNIZED PUBLIC HEALTH ISSUE, PARTICULARLY AMONG PUBLIC SAFETY PERSONNEL (PSP), MILITARY, VETERANS, AND HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS.

PTSD AND OTHER MENTAL HEALTH DISORDERS ARE CONCERNING FOR ALL CANADIANS, BUT ARE MORE PREVALENT IN THESE HIGH-RISK POPULATIONS BECAUSE OF OCCUPATIONAL FACTORS.

THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC HAS INCREASED OUR RELIANCE ON MEMBERS FROM WITHIN THESE ESSENTIAL PROFESSIONS. AT THE SAME TIME, THE PANDEMIC HAS TAKEN A TOLL ON THEIR PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH.

BACKGROUND ON THE GLOSSARY OF TERMS

THE GLOSSARY OF TERMS WAS CREATED TO PROMOTE A SHARED UNDERSTANDING OF MANY COMMON TERMS USED TO DESCRIBE MENTAL HEALTH CHALLENGES ARISING FROM EXPOSURE TO POTENTIALLY PSYCHOLOGICALLY TRAUMATIC EVENTS AND STRESSORS.

THE INITIAL ITERATION OF THE GLOSSARY WAS INTENDED TO 1) FACILITATE OPEN DISCOURSE AND CONVERSATIONS AMONG THE MANY PARTNERS AND STAKEHOLDERS AT THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON PTSD HELD IN 2019;

AND 2) ASSIST IN DEVELOPING THE FEDERAL FRAMEWORK ON PTSD. TO DATE, ACT C-211 STANDS AS THE ONLY FEDERAL GOVERNMENT ACT THAT ACKNOWLEDGES THE IMPORTANCE OF WORK-RELATED RISK FACTORS IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF PTSD IN CERTAIN PROFESSIONS.
